FROM THE SERVICE TO SERVICE

A story of valor and volunteering.

Leroy Jackson: Veteran, Volunteer, Slushie Enthusiast. After volunteering for over 8 years, Leroy has become a fixed member of the MOWLB family. Leroy did not begin his service to others with us, however. After first joining in 1976 through the Delayed Entry Program, Leroy served in the U.S. Army until 2003.

During his time in the Army, he worked on early satellite dishes. In discussing this, Leroy reflects on how frequently we are unaware of the rippling effects our actions have on the world around us, "None of us knew the impact of what we were doing. We just kept going to work."

Even now, Leroy's service causes ripples of impact throughout our community. As a Veteran, Leroy can connect on a deeper level with many clients who have also served. He recounts a special connection with one in particular: Leroy Fetter, another Army Veteran. Fetter, who describes himself as "an urban guy who found himself in Vietnam," was drafted in June of 1962 and served until his discharge in 1964.

In reflecting on his two points of service, Leroy J. focuses on the invisible thread that tethers all of us, and our community, together. He recounts noticing this thread in small situations, like when a client's daughter recognized him while grocery shopping, or larger ones, like meeting a client that's a fellow Veteran and shares his name.

Leroy is proud to be a Veteran and a MOWLB Volunteer. He emphasizes the importance of kindness and helping others whenever possible, "If you can, you

should... why not give someone a helping hand? You never


know when you'll need one."

More than a Pet: A MOWLB client story.

Larey, age 89, is an Air Force Veteran and retired Air Traffic Controller. After 58 years of marriage, Larey's wife passed away, leaving him with Sugar, their beloved dog, as his only companion. Larey's family adopted Sugar as a 2-year-old pup from the pound in 2004. Today, she's about 21 years old and although she has progressively lost her vision and hearing, she still keeps Larey on schedule.

"She wakes me up every day at 5:30 A.M. and makes sure we walk the block twice a day," Larey shares. Much like her internal alarm at 5:30 A.M., Sugar is also familiar with the MOWLB delivery schedule. Larey says that every day, right around 10:30 A.M, Sugar will sit and wait at the front window for their Meals on Wheels visitors to arrive with dinner for both her and Larey:
